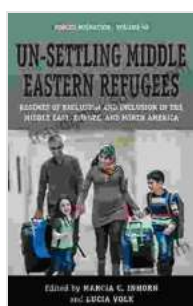

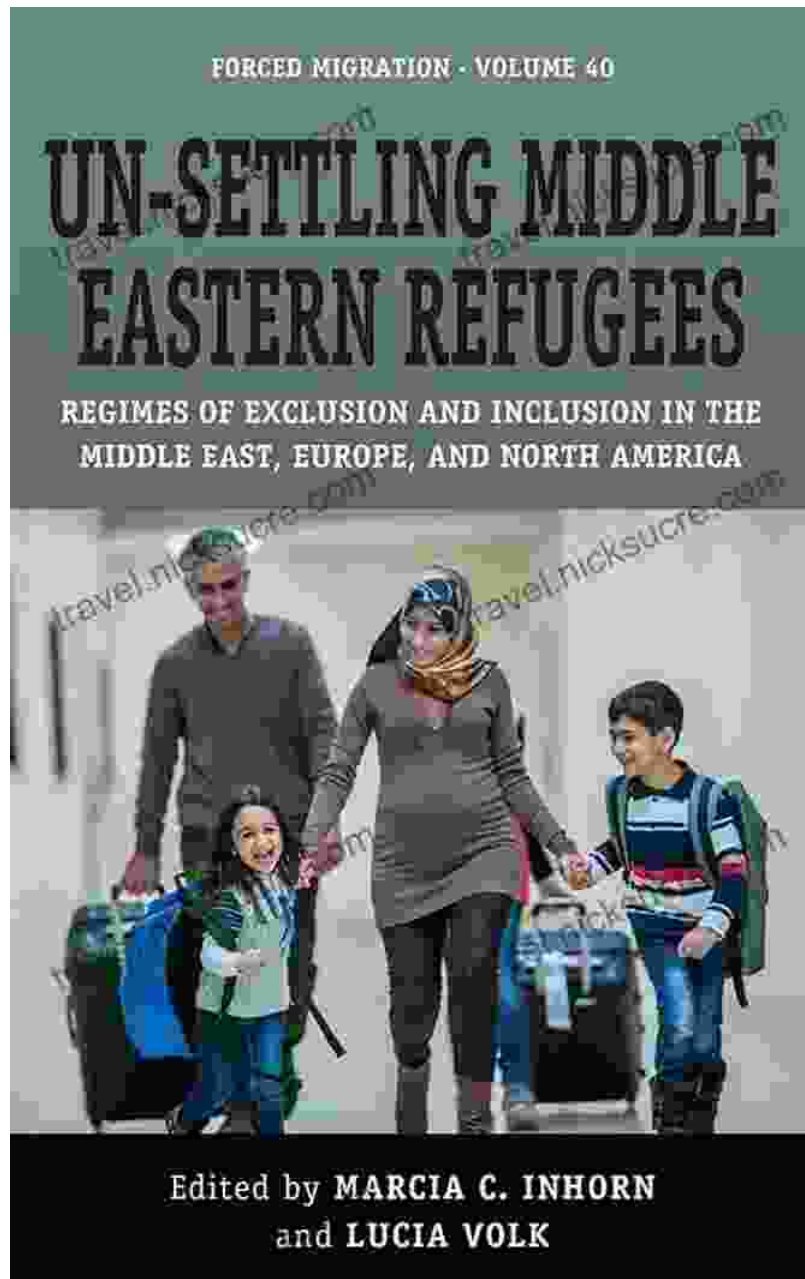

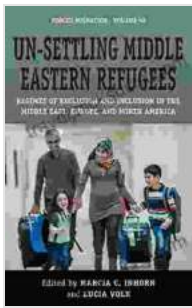

While apex students' body, North East Students' Organization (Neso) has called a strike across the northeast, the All Khasi Railwayshi

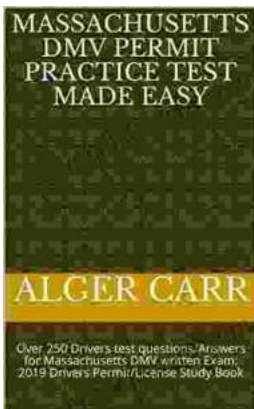

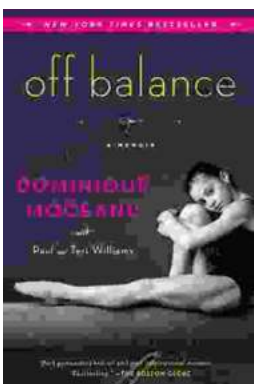
