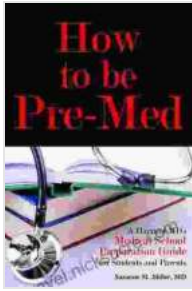

Academic Requirements

* Research experience * Clinical experience * Volunteer work * Leadership experience * Letters of recommendation

Extracurricular Activities

HMS values students who are well-rounded and have a variety of interests. The admissions committee will look for students who have been involved in extracurricular activities that demonstrate their leadership, teamwork, and commitment to service.

Some of the extracurricular activities that HMS admissions officers look for include:

* Volunteer work * Research experience * Clinical experience * Leadership positions * Musical or artistic activities * Sports * Travel

Personal Statement

The personal statement is a critical part of the HMS application. It is an opportunity for students to share their story and explain why they want to become a doctor. The personal statement should be well-written and should demonstrate the student's passion for medicine, their intellectual curiosity, and their commitment to serving others.

Here are some tips for writing a strong personal statement:

* Start by brainstorming your ideas and identifying the main themes you want to discuss. * Make a list of your accomplishments and experiences

that are relevant to medicine. * Write a draft of your personal statement and get feedback from trusted friends, family members, or mentors. * Revise and edit your personal statement until it is polished and error-free.

Interviews

Interviews are an important part of the HMS admissions process. They give the admissions committee an opportunity to meet students in person and assess their interpersonal skills, communication skills, and critical thinking skills.

HMS interviews are typically conducted by a panel of two or three interviewers, including a faculty member, a current student, and a member of the admissions staff. Interviews usually last for about 30 minutes and cover a range of topics, including:

* The student's academic background and research experience * The student's clinical experience * The student's extracurricular activities * The student's personal statement * The student's reasons for wanting to become a doctor

Financial Aid

HMS offers a variety of financial aid programs to help students pay for their education. These programs include:

* Scholarships * Grants * Loans * Work-study programs

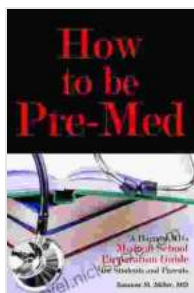
Students who are awarded financial aid must meet certain eligibility requirements, such as having a strong academic record and demonstrating financial need.
