Winning

The game is won by the player who first scores 13 points.

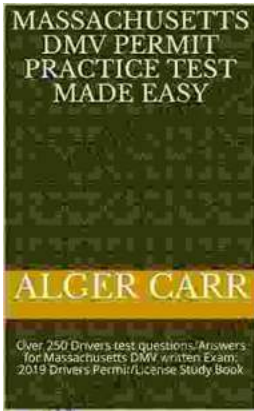

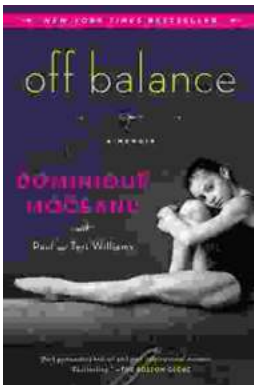
