
Two Teenage Immigrants' Inspiring Journey to Building a Life in America



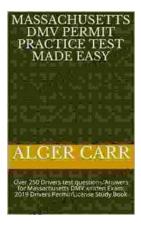
